[THIS SUNDAY 18 SEPTEMBER](#)

As previously advised, this Sunday is going to be slightly different as we navigate our first **FULL** market during Show bump-out. There are going to be some extra large marquees still in place over much of the outdoor area. This will impact some stallholders but not all. It will however not affect your ability to trade. In fact it might be quite nice to experience something completely different. On arrival please check in with the ASFM team to see what instructions (if any) apply to your site that you will need to follow for this week only. Next week we will be back to normal YAY!!

[STALLHOLDER/STAFF PARKING AT THIS SUNDAYS MARKET](#)

This Sunday, 18 September, stallholders and staff are required to park



along the Western Boulevard as the stallholder carpark is unavailable due to Show structure still in place. Please find a [MAP HERE](#) so you know where to park. **DO NOT** park in the customer carpark. The area immediately adjacent to northern toilets will **NO LONGER** be available for parking as this area will now be used for our new bike racks made available for customers.



POWER FOR INSIDE STALLHOLDERS

The RAHS have now provided a more permanent and reliable supply of power for inside stallholders via distribution boxes. This means stallholders will as from 25 September have to provide their own power leads from their stalls to the distribution boxes and power boards at their stalls. Please make sure that this week you assess what length of lead you need for next week as there will be **NO** leads available for your use after this Sunday. All leads and power boxes need to be tested and tagged prior to use at the Showground.



WASHING UP FACILITIES

Unfortunately there will be **NO** washing up facilities available in the pavilion this Sunday. Please **DO NOT** use the toilet or washrooms to do this. Dirty dishes will need to be taken away with you to be washed off site.



RESPONSIBLE PACKAGING POLICY

A reminder that all bags, packaging, plates, cups and crockery must meet the requirement of our Responsible Packaging Policy:

1. **ALL** stallholders must use and offer **EXCLUSIVELY** Certified Commercial Compostable AS4736, coffee/drink cups (including sampling cups), cutlery (including tasting) and straws. Non-compostable produce barrier bags, carry bags, coffee/drink cups (including sampling cups), cutlery (including tasting) and straws will no longer be able to be offered at the market by stallholders. Produce and carry bags must be both Certified Commercial Compostable AS4736 and Certified Home Compostable to Australian Standards AS5810

This does **NOT** allow for reusable bags that are not compostable.



2022 CITY TO BAY ROAD CLOSURES

A reminder that the City to Bay is on this Sunday 18th September, and that means access to Leader St, via Anzac Hwy or through parts of the city will be difficult. NEW BIKE RACKS

Our new customised bike racks will be in place from this Sunday and will be situated between the northern toilets and the Stirling Angas building.



These bike racks are made so they can be forked into place each week and removed when the Show ground needs access in that area. This will impact parking in this area, please see above note. (Picture is for attention only, not the actual bike rack design).



RUBBISH

A reminder that ALL stallholder rubbish must be taken **OFF SITE** by the stallholder and not placed into the bins provided for customers.
